Matthew 9:38 Ask the Lord...to send:

- (1) This verse expresses one of God's most important spiritual principles about our actions and our part in his plans. Our part in the work is necessary because before God takes action, he usually inspires his people to pray. Only after they have prayed does God respond and finish what he desires to happen. What it means is that God has limited himself, choosing to accomplish his plans through the prayers of his faithful people.
- (2) It is clear from the context of this passage (9:35–10:1, 8) that the kind of workers Jesus desires in his kingdom are those who are willing and spiritually prepared to spread his message and teach others what it means to follow Jesus and live according to his purposes.

- (2) If your treasure is in God's kingdom (i.e., his purposes on earth that will have effect for eternity) and you are motivated by his Word, his presence and your relationship to him, then your heart will be drawn closer to him. As a result, your life will be set on his eternal purposes as you prepare for the Lord's return (vv. 35–40).
